This Wednesday! Watch the ORS ISFR 3-Minute Research Pitch Competition



The ORS ISFR (International Section of Fracture Repair) 3-Minute Research Pitch will take place live, this Wednesday, June 21, at 12:00 pm Central on Zoom. Participating researchers will have three minutes to present what they are working on and why it is important to the field of research of bone regeneration, fracture repair, trauma, or other related topic. Following each three minute presentation, two minutes will be allowed for one question from the audience or judges. The winner of the competition will receive a \$500 award.

In 2017, the ORS ISFR initiated the first competition as part of their ORS ISFR Scientific Meeting. ORS Student, Post-Graduate, and Early Career members were challenged to present the significance of their research in a compelling pitch to a panel of judges. This is an important communication skill and excellent way for scientists to relay our field's research to the fellow research community members and the public.
